SECOND READING

A reading from the the letter of St Paul to the Philippians
2:1-11

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people’s interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus:

His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a

slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, ‘What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, “My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today.” He answered, “I will not go,” but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, “Certainly, sir,” but did not go. Which of the two did the father’s will?’ ‘The first’ they said. Jesus said to them, ‘I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.’

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Today’s Gospel comes towards the end of Jesus’ ministry. He has just entered Jerusalem, been welcomed joyously by the Jewish crowds and driven out the traders in the Temple. (21:1-17) The chief priests and scribes challenge Jesus’ authority to act as in this way: ‘By what authority are you doing these things? Who gave you this authority?’ (21:23) Jesus turns their question back onto them when he asks them about John’s baptism. What was John’s authority? The chief priests avoid an answer by claiming ignorance and then Jesus tells them the parable we read today of the two sons. Jesus’ question to his opponents places the focus on how people act, on what they *do* and not on what they say. ‘Which of the two *did* the father’s will?’ Being a true religious person is a matter of what we do, and not what we say. Jesus criticised the religious leaders of his time for their behaviour. They did not undergo the repentance John called for, while the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Jesus reverses the standard for being a truly religious person. It is not a matter of status or position but deeds. As my former school motto states, ‘*Facta non verba* – Deeds not words’. According to Matthew’s view, the final judgment will not be asking about what we know, or the status we hold, but will raise the following questions: Did you visit the sick? Did you clothe the naked? Did you feed the hungry? Did you welcome the stranger? Our Christianity is judged on these very practical acts of concern for others. If our faith does not lead us to action then we find ourselves in the position of the second son, who sounds good but his words are hollow.

REMEMBERING, WORKING AND PRAYING FOR MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES On this 106th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, we remember, pray for, and commit to working to change the horrible reality of many in 'our own backyard'. We acknowledge and give thanks for the many parish communities across the state, along with those working within our Catholic social services and other organisations and community groups, who are making considerable efforts to assist people seeking asylum, refugees, and other migrants who hold temporary visas—many remain in harsh circumstances in detention centres, and the majority of the 115,000 living in the Australian community have been deemed ineligible for any federal government support payments during COVID-19, making many at risk of homelessness and despair. In his message for World Day for Migrants and Refugees, Pope Francis tells us, "You have to know in order to understand" and "It is necessary to be close, in order to serve". Only when different elements of the community work together — individuals, parishes, schools, universities and organisations — can we effectively advocate for systemic change and provide for people's immediate necessities and other spiritual and social needs. 
