FOCUS ON THE WORD The word 'Trinity' does not appear anywhere in the New Testament although one can certainly see the beginnings of ideas about a Trinitarian God. It was not until 325, at the Council of Nicea, that the doctrine of the trinity was established as being orthodox teaching. This council sought to officially define the relationship between the Father and the Son as a response to the arguments of Arius (later known as Arian heresy). The statement of beliefs developed by this council in 325 is the Creed (credo = I believe) that is used in Catholic churches around the world today. Jesus' instruction that the disciples go out to all the nations and baptise them 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' is an instruction that is still being carried on today. Those precise words are used by the priest at every baptism. They are also the words used in the sign of the cross – whether that is a personal, private blessing of oneself or a blessing of a group as in the introductory and dismissal rites as part of a Eucharistic celebration. When we make the sign of the cross we use the words of Jesus. © Greg Sunter

Dear Friends.

As most of you will be aware by now, the Acting Premier has announced that Victoria will enter into a seven-day lockdown from 11.59pm tonight in order to contain the current spread of COVID-19.

Unfortunately, this means our Parishes and offices will be closed during this time and all staff (including parish office staff) must work from home until Friday 4 June 2021, unless otherwise notified.

Parish facilities, such as community halls, cannot be opened during the lockdown period. Consistent with the last lockdown, restrictions apply for Ceremonies and Religious gatherings:

- Prayer and Religious Ceremonies: No in-person gatherings permitted. Livestreaming and Broadcast is permitted with a total of 5 people present including technicians.
- Funerals: (indoor and outdoor): Permitted with no more than 10 people (and those necessary to conduct the funeral). Children under 12 months old are not counted towards this cap.
- Weddings: (indoor and outdoor): Not permitted unless end of life or for deportation reasons. Involves only 5 persons (including the two persons being married, celebrant, two witnesses)

I understand this will be a challenging time for many people. Hopefully we can draw further on our stores of resilience and continue to show our care and support for those around us. If you are experiencing any difficulty or need support, please reach out to Fr Thomas.
