

THE FEAST DAY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST.

in the 4th century A.D., in honour of the birth of the Saint John the Baptist, which the Christian Bible records as being sixth months before Jesus. St. John the Baptist is a famous Bible character who is also the patron saint of many different subjects, including builders, tailors, printers, baptism, conversion to faith, people dealing with storms and their effects (like hail), and people who need healing from spasms or seizures.

John's outspokenness about the importance of living with faith and integrity cost him his life. He died as a martyr in 31 AD.

Matthew chapter 6 of the Bible says that Herodias, the wife of King Herod, "had a grudge" (verse 19) against John because he told Herod that she shouldn't have divorced her first husband to marry him. Herodias convinced Herod's daughter to ask Herod to give her John's head on a platter at a royal banquet -- after Herod had promised publicly to give his daughter anything she wanted, because of her beautiful dancing.
