A reading from book of the Apocalypse Rev 11: 19, 12:1-6, 10

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it.

She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. 

FOCUS ON THE WORD: Since the 5th Century there has been an active tradition and belief around the assumption of Mary. The tradition states that Mary was physically 'taken up' into heaven at the end of her life. It is believed that her soul and her body remained united. This ancient belief was defined as an infallible teaching of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1950. It is one of only two infallible statements that have been defined as such and both related to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The feast is celebrated on August 15 and is a Holy Day of Obligation.

The restoration of life to those who are shamed and oppressed that is exemplified in Elizabeth is a compelling theme of the gospel of Luke. Time and again, those who are ground down by a lack of life are given new hope and new life by the extravagant love of God. And throughout Luke, the recipients of this new life are women. The widow of Nain (7:11-15); the sinful woman who washed Jesus' feet (7:36-50); the woman with a haemorrhage (8:43-48); Jairus' daughter (8:40-56); and the crippled woman (13:10-17) are all examples of this outpouring of new life. © Greg Sunter



NATIONAL COVID-19 BEREAVEMENT PROJECT. Each year, at least 44,000 Australians will develop chronic and debilitating mental health impairments following the death of a family member or a close friend. Bereavement during the COVID-19 pandemic, whether attributable to the virus or not, presents additional significant risk factors for poor mental health due to public health measures such as physical distancing, travel restrictions, visitor limitations and reduced physical contact. Currently, little is known about the mental health effects and support needs of people bereaved during and following global crises, such as the COVID-19 pandemic.

To address this significant gap, researchers at the University of Technology Sydney (UTS) are undertaking a National COVID-19 Bereavement Project, funded by the Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF). The project has brought together the nation's leading bereavement and palliative care experts and industry associations. Chief Investigator on the project is Adjunct Professor Liz Lobb from the Improving Palliative, Aged and Chronic Care through Clinical Research and Translation (IMPACCT) Researchers at the University of Technology Sydney invite you to take part in this important research study that explores the experiences and support needs of people bereaved from any cause during the COVID-19 pandemic.

If you feel ready to reflect on your experience, participation in the study will consist of a 30 minute anonymous online survey that asks about your experience of bereavement, the kind of support (if any) you have received and wanted, what has been most helpful and least helpful for you, and any other comments you would like to make.
