## A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised. or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.



**FOCUS ON THE WORD:** We see here that the rich man's focus was completely on himself. With an abundance of goods there doesn't seem to be any thoughts on how he can help anyone else. His thoughts were purely on himself and having an easy life. His self-focus is expressed nicely in the following little ditty:

'I had a little tea party, This afternoon at three. 'Twas very small - Three guests in all, Just I, Myself, and Me. Myself ate all the sandwiches, While I drank up the tea. 'Twas also I who ate the pie, And passed the cake to Me.... Why was the rich man a fool?

- He was a foolish man because he lived only for himself and not for others.
- He was a foolish man because he thought he had a foolproof plan to get all that he needed for an easy life but he left God out of that plan.
- And he was a foolish man because he thought and planned only for this life and not for the next. And that is foolish.

The solution is found in Jesus' last words of this parable. Jesus said to be rich towards God. How can we be rich towards God? He's not just talking about money though it can involve money. You can be rich towards God in your thoughts. Do you think about Him? Do you like to meditate on His truth? You can be rich towards God with your time. Do you have much time for God? You can be rich towards God with your gifting and abilities. You can be rich towards God in your faith and how you express that in helping others. © by I Gordon


