



called "The Dinner Table." And it begins: "We are on a mission to reunite families at the Dinner Table. Join us at *The Dinner Table* to help families reconnect and communicate more effectively. We want to help families be closer, sharing and loving. The Dining Table is not only an area for eating but a place for gathering, sharing, communicating and where relationships grow. Here we will share ideas that will help make gathering around the table enjoyable and meaningful for all members of your family. Sometimes it may be difficult to



start a conversation, but asking questions can help your family members to connect on a deeper level. Here are a wide range of interesting topics that they will enjoy and even learn from, without any lecturing. We have hundreds of questions for you to use that will get everyone involved. There are three simple things for engaging with family members. 1. Ask good questions. 2 Commit to listening and not lecturing. 3.Enjoy the discussion and stay curious! - Don't shy away from expressing your opinions; kids are often curious what parents think.
