

SAFER INTERNET DAY The world is more digitally connected than it's ever been, which means vigilance about online safety is more important than ever before. **Tuesday 7 February 2023** marks the 20th Safer Internet Day, an initiative that started in 2004 and is now recognised by countries around the world. The day provides an opportunity to reflect on how we might create safer online environments for the children and young people under our care. The theme for this year's Safer Internet Day is **Connect. Reflect. Protect.** Children and young people spend approximately 7.5 hours per day online, which means half their year is spent on the internet. The potential risks of increased online usage and the severity of these risks are sometimes overlooked.

It's difficult for parents, organisations and even the police to monitor the internet, so to assist the community, the Australian Childhood Foundation has released a new resource-It's Never Too Late. Through real stories and practical advice, the resource informs parents and carers about how they can better protect their children online and shows them how to recognise signs of online abuse and manipulation.
