FOCUS ON THE WORD The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessing of the harvest. Jesus breathes his Holy Spirit on the disciples, this Spirit comes upon them with power. In the name of Jesus, in every language, they are empowered to preach about "the great things God has done. "Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, 'Vene Sancte Spiritus'", has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.
