FOCUS ON THE WORD: Some scholars today suggest that before his own public ministry Jesus was a follower of John the Baptist and that it was John who nurtured the call to ministry within Jesus and encouraged him to respond to that call. Regardless of whether or not this was the case, John and Jesus were cousins and the image that we have from the infancy narratives of Luke is that their mothers – Mary and Elizabeth – were very close and we can assume that Jesus and John were equally close and spent a lot of time together growing up. John's decision to go out into the wilderness to live an ascetic lifestyle must have made a big impact on his cousin. John's ministry was a ministry to the Jewish people only. It was a call to them to repent and

return to God's ways. The baptism that he encouraged people to undertake was a baptism of repentance – different from our Christian understanding of Baptism. For John and his followers, the call to baptism was a call to acknowledge one's wrongdoing and, through the baptism in the river Jordan, to be cleansed ready to recommit living in right relationship with God.

When John announced Jesus as the one coming after him, he recognised that Jesus would take John's own ministry to a new level. Whereas John's message was for the Jews alone, the message of Jesus was for all people – Jew and Gentile alike. John's simple existence – apparently surviving on locusts and wild honey – is in stark contrast to the feast of the reign of God that Jesus heralds. Rather than John's call to prepare the way of the Lord, Jesus called all people to *live* the way of the Lord. © Greg Sunter



WORLD YOUTH DAY NEWS 38 days to go!

In August this year, more than 500 young people from Melbourne will arrive in Lisbon, Portugal, for World Youth Day. This will be the first time the event has been held in Portugal, a country with a rich and multilayered history.



With its history of exploration and empire-building, Catholic devotion and Muslim occupation, Portugal has been shaped by both distinctively Arabic and distinctively European influences. Portugal is a predominantly Catholic country, with 80 per cent of its citizens identifying themselves as such. In Portugal, there are 21 dioceses and 4380 parishes. Tourist sites in the area include: Sao Jorge Castle (St George's Castle) human presence on the hill can be traced back to the 8th Century BC, and Lisbon Cathedral- construction of which began in 1147. Excavations in the cathedral cloisters have revealed ruins dating back to the Romans.

SYNOD WORKING DOCUMENT On Tuesday

evening, the Secretariat of the Synod published the *Instrumentum Laboris*, or working document, for the first session of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops - commonly referred to as the Synod on Synodality. The first session will take place this October; the second and final session is scheduled for October 2024. Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB, president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and a member of the Synod's preparatory commission, said it had been an extraordinary process to get to this point, with Catholics across the world helping shape the working document. 'Countless people have invested their hopes, their prayer, their time and their energy in helping the entire people of God consider how we can share in the mission entrusted by God to the Church,' he said. 'This is the latest, and an enormously significant, milestone in a journey which has spanned several years. It represents both an invitation and an opportunity to remain engaged in prayer, reflection and ongoing discernment with all that has emerged so far in what has been an unprecedented worldwide consultation.' 'The three central themes for this Synod of Bishops communion, mission and participation – remain at the heart of this document. We are being invited to adopt them as a fundamental lens through which we can evaluate all we are doing.
