Each year, Catholics from all corners of Australia gather on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday to celebrate the unique gifts and contributions of Australia's First Peoples. This year's theme, "A New Life in Christ" reflects the hope and promise of a brighter future, rooted in unity and shared commitment to positive change. As we commemorate this special day on the Liturgical Calendar. we invite you to listen to our voices and walk alongside us on our journey towards progress. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday symbolizes our unity as one people in Christ.

IMPORTANT PROJECT NEWS on Thursday 22nd June 2023, Fr Thomas, Rev Peter Stringfellow, the Parish Finance Committee, the Parish Pastoral Group & Parish Secretary, met in the school staff room, together with our School Principal Kelli Johnston, Deputy, Ursula De Corrado and representatives from Crosier Scott Architects to discuss a building proposal for the school. The focus of discussion at this meeting being the Master Plan, and a grant of \$3m dollars for building works within the school. Crosier Scott have identified the problem of our Parish Hall being landlocked within the school grounds, giving poor access during school hours, and the need for a new school classroom block. After listening to several options, consensus was reached, that the Parish would agree, in principle, to swapping the Parish Hall, which is in need of significant maintenance, for the School Library, which will become the Parish Hall, and the existing Parish Hall will be demolished, to make way for a new purpose-built schoolroom complex and resource room. Doing this will allow for easy access to the Parish Hall, with better mobility access, as well as reduced financial strain related to required Hall repairs, and would create well defined school and Parish Zones, leading to better safety for children, and better access to the hall for parishioners. A letter of recommendation has been completed and we are awaiting the final decision to be made by the Vicar General. In the meantime, you will have noticed that work has commenced on a fence and gate, that will ensure the safety of students, during school hours,. It will create more parking for parishioners, and those accessing the Parish Hall and Church. We will still have access to the playground for parking on the Weekends, and for Funerals.
