You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' FOCUS ON THE WORD God's love is faithful! Mary will give birth to a son. **Holy is his name!** Our first reading focuses on the promise made to David – a member of his family would be a great king whose kingdom would last forever. This reading is filled with the fidelity of God: "I called you....I have always been with you....I promise to be with you forever....He will be like a son to me....I will never take my love away from him."

That promise is fulfilled in the Annunciation.

By the power of the Spirit, Mary will give birth to a child, and "he will be the ruler of the family of David." In both of these readings we see the power of God at work in human beings – God's faithful love made real in history.

Pope Francis suggests that sometimes we need to stop and remind ourselves what matters most. We should never let our busyness push Jesus away from our minds and hearts and behaviours. 'Consumerism is not found in the manger in Bethlehem', the Pope points out.

Rather, the Pope sees the manger as something which can teach us about the real meaning of Christmas. It shows us, he says, the importance of closeness, poverty, and concreteness. By closeness he means the closeness of God with humanity, which should always give us hope and lead us to be close to others. 'The poverty of the manger', he adds, 'shows us where the true riches in life are to be found: not in money and power, but in relationships and persons.'

Dear friends, we hear these words from the ancient prophet Isaiah (52:7):

How beautiful upon the mountains

are the feet of the messenger who announces peace,
