FOCUS ON THE WORD To fully understand this week's gospel passage, it is important to take the first reading into consideration as well. The account from 2 Chronicles describes the way in which the **people began to neglect their relationship with God**. Despite prophets and messengers being sent to them, they turned their backs on God. At about this time the Israelites were conquered, the Temple in Jerusalem destroyed, and the survivors taken into exile in Babylon. For many, this was seen as a punishment from God because of their neglectful and selfish behaviour. But the reading demonstrates God's infinite patience with humankind. God gives the people another chance and calls on them to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem. God is willing to wipe the slate clean and start afresh. It is in this context that we must understand the gospel passage. In yet another attempt to demonstrate love and forgiveness, God's only Son - the Word made Flesh - is sent into the world to lead the people from darkness to light. Despite the many, many attempts by God to demonstrate love and foster a relationship with humankind, the people have repeatedly rejected the relationship with God and preferred to live a life of selfishness and darkness. Yet we see through both of these readings the unquenchable nature of God who keeps giving humankind one more chance.

The 4th Sunday of Lent is also called LAETARE SUNDAY. We are about halfway through Lent. On this day, we consider how Jesus heals us and saves us from our sin. Laetare Sunday has traditionally been viewed as a day of celebration, on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened; the organ is played, flowers are allowed on the altar, and the purple vestments of Lent, signifying penance, are set aside and, as on <u>Gaudete Sunday</u> in <u>Advent</u>, rose ones are used instead.

CELEBRATING 170vears of St Vincent de Paul Society in Australia 1854-2024 - Fr Gerald Ward arrived in Melbourne in 1850 from England where he was familiar with the work of the Society of St Vincent de Paul. After serving a number of Parishes, he was appointed Parish Priest of St Francis's in the city. There he established the first conference in Australia, on 5th March 1854. He became our first official 'conference president' and set about addressing problems, such as the devastatingly high numbers of homeless and deserted children roaming the streets- the direct result of parents leaving for the Gold Rush fields, such as Ballarat and Bendigo. In 1855 Fr Ward became responsible for five orphaned children and, after discussions with the government, he witnessed the laying of the foundation stone for the SVDP Orphanage in Sth Melbourne, where the first children were accepted in 1857. This was considered the first "Special work" of the Society in Australia. Fr Ward tragically died in 1858, less than 10vrs of arriving in Australia, and was widely known as "one in whom many a widow and orphan had found a good friend". Fr Ward's enduring legacy is the continuation of his early work through the Society's 242 conferences, 3,632 members, 6.434 volunteers and 113 Vinnies Shops across Victoria. A huge congratulations to the SVDP, for reaching this 170th Anniversary on 5th March 2024.
