It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

FOCUS ON THE WORD Happy Easter! Alleluia! He is Risen! Today we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus - from the grave. Jesus tells us that the restoration of our physical bodies is not simply a distant dream. No, Jesus said, "I am the Resurrection and the Life." Then he adds, "No one comes to the Father except through me." By a personal relationship with Jesus through prayer and sacraments, we already participate in the Resurrection. St. Paul speaks about that relationship when he tells us, "If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above." St. Paul says that we have already been raised with Christ. Unfortunately, even on Easter day, many people can feel like they are still in the tomb. They feel discouraged. Especially this past year, with so many economic problems, it sometimes seems like our society is unraveling. When you add family problems and personal failings, it is easy to feel discouraged. If you feel burdened today, I ask you to think about these words of Pope John Paul the Great: "We are not the sum of our failures. We are the sum of the Father's love for us - and our real capacity is to become the image of his Son Jesus."
